Which is better for the environment and the well being of the local community.

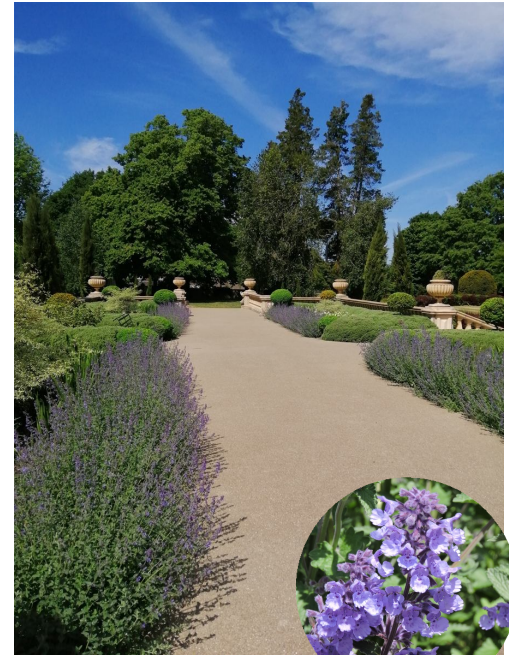

Last year we planted nearly 100 Nepeta plants on the top Italian terraces.

The Achillea bed is also a success, it was only planted in February 2020 with 250 plants of 10 different varieties and now it is coming into full bloom with an array of colour.
