Deutzia x rosea 'Carninea' Common name: Deutzia Family name: Hydrangeaeae

Facts: At the end of the nineteenth century, the French grower Lemoine, crossed Deutzia gracilis with Deutzia purpuracens (interspecific hybrid).

The result of this union produced some of the most beautiful Deutzia plants to be found in any garden or park.

The plant was named for Johann van de Deutz

The plant is native to eastern Asia and central America.

Position: Full sun, dapple shade.

➤ Hardiness: Frost hardy up to -15°C to -20°C.

Flowering: Summer flowering (clusters of pinkish fragrant flowers).

- ➤ **Propagation:** soft nodal cuttings in early summer or hardwood cuttings in autumn (cold-frame).
- ➤ **Pruning:** Little or no pruning is necessary (dead, diseased or damaged), may need rejuvenation pruning when plant becomes too big, do this after flowering.
- > **Pest and diseases:** Generally, pest and disease free.
