



Worth Park Gardens Victorian Plants



Deutzia x rosea 'Carninea'
Common name: Deutzia
Family name: Hydrangeaceae

Facts: At the end of the nineteenth century, the French grower Lemoine, crossed *Deutzia gracilis* with *Deutzia purpuracens* (interspecific hybrid).

The result of this union produced some of the most beautiful *Deutzia* plants to be found in any garden or park.

The plant was named for Johann van de Deutz

The plant is native to eastern Asia and central America.

- **Position:** Full sun, dapple shade.
- **Hardiness:** Frost hardy up to -15°C to -20°C.
- **Flowering:** Summer flowering (clusters of pinkish fragrant flowers).
- **Propagation:** soft nodal cuttings in early summer or hardwood cuttings in autumn (cold-frame).
- **Pruning:** Little or no pruning is necessary (dead, diseased or damaged), may need rejuvenation pruning when plant becomes too big, do this after flowering.
- **Pest and diseases:** Generally, pest and disease free.
